Beginning the Year

This week we will continue to focus heavily on rules and routines, especially for our newer friends.

We will work hard to help your child learn the names of their new classmates, and begin to form some friendships.

We will work on arts and crafts projects surrounding an "all about me" theme. They will share these projects with their peers as 'get to know you' activities. These activities will also help familiarize your child with letter concepts.

We will also introduce concepts of size and shape by measuring your child's height with yarn. They will compare and contrast each other's heights and we will introduce some simple terms (taller, shorter, equal) that will lay a foundation for later learning more complex math terms.
